  - This money is meant to be used in ways to make Salem vibrant or bring in things that the town currently lacks (recreation, beautification, business needs, etc).
  - The Foundation is striving to raise more money by the end of the year. They have a matching grant for another \$50,000.
  - The library can apply for grant money!

# Facility Update

- <u>New Electrical Hook Up Behind Circulation Desk:</u> Mark Cooney is rewiring and adding in some new electrical outlets behind the circulation desk that will alleviate the pile of cords on the floor. This will help keep that area from being a place where someone could trip and potentially get hurt.
- <u>Making Check-Out Easier:</u> Also, Karen and Melissa are working on finding a way to make checking out easier for patrons on the outside of the circulation desk (as per conversation at May meeting). Currently a small table has been placed by the check-out desk, and patrons use it regularly.
- **Lobby Makeover:** Melissa has been thinking about ways to make the lobby a more welcoming, safe, easy-to-navigate, and easy-to-clean space.
