- Book Donations We are still working on getting a book drop bin for book donations. Melissa
  went to the Historic Preservation Commission meeting to get approval for placement of the book
  bin. However, BetterWorldBooks could not accommodate our request for the bin to be along the
  courtyward walkway. Second placement idea is being checked (placement would be to the left of
  the judge's door).
- Tutoring Kits We are exploring ways to create kits for our Tri-County Literacy tutors. Likely
  these kits will contain bilingual books, flash cards, and other materials that TCL recommends and
  supports the needs of our tutors and students.
